

FULL START

All Thorp students will return to our regular schedule of 5 days of in-person instruction. The regular schedule is as follows:

Kindergarten - 12th Grade

Monday 8:30 am - 3:00 pm Tuesday 8:30 am - 3:00 pm Wednesday 8:30 am - 3:00 pm Thursday 8:30 am - 3:00 pm Fridays 8:30 am - 1:30 pm

Preschool

Monday 8:30 am - 12:30 pm Tuedsay 8:30 am - 12:30 pm Wednesday 8:30 am - 12:30 pm Thursday 8:30 am - 12:30 pm

MASKS & SOCIAL DISTANCING

Students and staff are expected to wear a mask properly and observe social distancing protocols on the bus and while at school. Students will stay within their class cohort and assigned classes to limit interactions with other cohorts of students as much as possible. This will reduce the risk of transmission of Covid-19, and will help prevent the need to shut down the entire school if a student or staff member becomes ill.

ARRIVING AT SCHOOL

Students will enter through the gym doors upon arrival. Students will be asked to sanitize their hands before attending class. Staff and students will have their temperatures taken upon entry. Staff will check to make sure students are wearing masks and have completed their wellness screenings.



MEALS

All students attending school will have the opportunity to order a school provided meal for lunch free of charge under the Summer Food Service Program. If you currently have a child who is receiving take home meals, but is not enrolled in the district, their meal

service will continue.

Breakfast will not be served at school.

Families can order breakfast for their student online at www.thorpschools. org/food-service. Breakfast for the following day will be sent home with students after school.

WELLNESS SCREENINGS

All staff and students must have completed a Wellness Screening before attending school. Screenings may be completed on Skyward or by using the orange paper Wellness Screening sheets. Students in 6th- 12th grade may complete their own screenings.

TRANSPORTATION

Buses will run along their regular routes. Due to the increased stops and passengers, buses may run early or late. Please allow an additional 5 minutes as we finalize routes.

BACKPACKS

Students need to bring a backpack each day. There will be no access to lockers for secondary students.

CHROMEBOOKS & IPADS

School issued technology will remain at school. If students need to take home technology, they may work with their teachers to check out equipment.

WATER BOTTLES

There is no access to water fountains. Students need to bring a reusable water bottle to school each day.

COUNSELOR CORNER

Spring is in the air! It's a great time to go outside and get some fresh air and exercise. Doing this can help increase positivity, release stress, and improve overall mental health. The Thorp School staff have been working hard to implement Social Emotional Learning (SEL) programs including Character Strong and The Zones of Regulation. SUPERINTENDENT






community has continued to shine despite the challenges we have faced. Our success is possible because we all rally behind doing what is best for our students.


ADMINISTRATION



We are in the final stages of putting together the infrastructure for our school garden. The nursery is complete and has been used by FFA, for plant starts, and by the art class, for pottery.

Work on the garden this spring will include installing an automated irrigation system to each zone (each class will have their own space), a security fence to keep young students in and rabbits out, a compost pile, a shed for garden implements, a robotic farm installation, a game camera, an outdoor education classroom/pergola, and a weather station.

Our goal is to complete the infrastructure this spring, send P-6th grade teachers

Please go to the App Store for iPhone or Google Play for Android and download the free SafeSchools Alert Mobile App:

- 1. Search for the SafeSchools Alert Mobile App in the App Store or Google Play.
- 2. Select "Download" to add the free app to your mobile device.
- 3. The first time you open the app, you'll be asked to submit our district's four-digit code 1081 in order to connect your tip submissions to our district team.
- 4. After the code is submitted, you'll be asked to confirm your district's name: Thorp School District.
- 5. Once the district name is confirmed, you'll see the modules that are available to submit tips through (e.g. bullying, safety, violence).
- 6. You'll see a confirmation page after submission to confirm that your tip was successfully submitted.
- 7. Any tips that are submitted will automatically be routed to the appropriate administrators.
- 8. If we send any messages or replies to your tip, you will automatically receive a push notification.


